SEEDS (entering grades 1-2)

We offer a supportive and nurturing environment for our young campers who are gaining more independence but still sometimes need assistance. Our counselors are always on hand to help - whether it's applying sunscreen, playing tetherball together or helping them make a friend.

LEAVES (entering grades 3-4)

These campers are ready for action! Our counselors recognize the need for this age group to be challenged physically and socially. This is the stage when huge leaps in confidence are made. We are ready to help these kids grow!

TREES (entering grades 5-7)

Our Trees are ready for their own space, activities and independence. Our counselors lead age-appropriate activities and provide opportunities for the Trees to take leadership roles

CHALUTZIM Counselors in Training (entering grades 8-10)

Chalutzim enjoy spending time with younger kids and be prepared to help them with tasks like cleaning up a game or helping with an activity. They are ready to take responsibility for supervising campers and expected to assist their counselors as needed. Older Chalutzim, and those who show they are ready for a bigger leadership role, will have the opportunity to plan and lead some activities. Chalutzim will always be under the supervision of Camp Shalom staff.

Chalutzim will be guided and supervised by a Unit Leader. This group will have special programming including leadership-building activities and field trips. They will receive a stipend of \$5/day for working at camp and will be paid each Friday for the current week.

CAMPERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Our campers participate in a wide variety of activities on camp grounds. Our outside play area includes a gaga pit, 9 square in the air, a sandbox and a basketball hoop. We have abundant outdoor space that's used for sports such as volleyball, kickball and capture the flag. All of our campers get the opportunity to work in our camp garden which is a fantastic resource for learning about science, nature, food security and cooking. Our other on-camp activities include music, Judaics, dance, drama, yoga and nature. We also welcome special visitors to lead unique programs for our campers.















At Camp Shalom, our goal is to inspire confidence in our campers. We provide a framework for lasting memories and friendships. We offer quality programs with low camper-to-staff ratios that are age appropriate, challenging and fun. We welcome all children and strive to make sure there are ways for each camper to learn, grow and have a great time at camp! We believe that children from all backgrounds can thrive within the cultural treasures that Judaism offers. Camp Shalom focuses on the Jewish values of kindness, persistence, community, creativity, friendship, and courage.



SPECIALTY CAMPS

Specialty camp activities are scheduled in the morning. Campers will spend their lunchtime and afternoon with the rest of Camp Shalom participating in traditional camp activities, swimming and field trips.

Lego • Week 2 (June 13-17) Grades: 1-3 • \$225

Calling all creative campers! Stretch your imagination to the limit with Legos! This specialty camp is for kids who can't get enough of building and rebuilding. Campers will be guided by an experienced Lego coach on a variety of projects. Lego Camp is the perfect opportunity for children to learn 21st century skills such as communication, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking.

Woodcraft • Week 2 (June 13-17) Grades: 4-7 • \$275

Campers will work in an actual wood shop guided by an experienced instructor. They will learn woodworking safety and be supervised every step of the way while creating incredible projects they will be proud of. Woodworking is the perfect activity to engage campers in learning life skills such as socialemotional learning, interpersonal skills, and perseverance.

Biking • Week 3 (June 20-24) Grades: 3-7 • \$225

Explore our beautiful Miami Valley by bike! Campers will start the week with a class on basic bike maintenance by the manager and mechanic from K&G Bike Center. They will learn how to read a trail map and trail etiquette. Then we'll hit the trails! Campers must supply their own bicycle (in good condition) as well as a bike helmet.

Theatre • Week 3 - 6 (June 20- July 15) Grades: 1-7 • \$875

Finally, a creative outlet for your drama queen/king! In this four-week specialty camp, your camper will participate in a junior musical from start to finish. Guided by a director, they will learn a variety of acting skills and exercises. They will be trained in the basics of theatre, performance, character development and ensemble building. As part of the camp, they will also spend time creating the set and making props. The campers will perform their show the afternoon of July 15. Must attend all four weeks.

Tennis • Week 4 (June 27-July 1) Grades: 1-7 \$225

Open to players of all skill levels. Participants will be divided into groups by ability. They will spend their mornings on the court, guided by tennis pros working on basic skills such as ground strokes, volleys, overheads, serve and footwork.

Art • Week 5 (July 5-8) Grades: 1-3 • \$185

Making Imaginary Lands is a uniquely fantastical camp that introduces the art of cartography, or mapmaking. Each day we will work on a different aspect of our map such as coastline, mountains, rivers and oceans, compass rose and lettering. We even figure out who lives in our land and illustrate our characters!



Field trips are a core part of Camp Shalom, and many campers' favorite part of summer! We will visit unique sites throughout the Miami Valley and engage in exciting activities like fishing, rafting and caving. Campers will also enjoy free swim twice a week at Five Seasons Sports Club.
