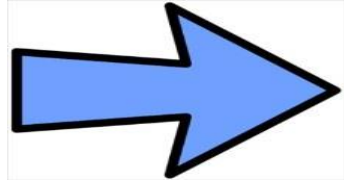


Sukkot

We will be making Israeli flags to celebrate the reading of the Torah and Judaic culture. It is a joyous holiday that celebrates the Jewish love of Torah and study. We will march seven times around, in an out of the upstairs rooms! This is called *hakafot*. The fall is full of holidays. 


Please check your child’s clothing box for fall clothing as the weather gets cooler. If your child has borrowed clothing please be sure to return it for the next accident.
