CHALUTZIM, COUNSELORS IN TRAINING (ENTERING GRADES 8-10)

Chalutzim enjoy spending time with younger kids and are prepared to help them with tasks like cleaning up a game or helping with an activity. They are ready to take responsibility for supervising campers and expected to assist their counselors as needed. Older Chalutzim, and those who show they are ready for a bigger leadership role, will have the opportunity to plan and lead some activities. Chalutzim will always be under the supervision of Camp Shalom staff.

Chalutzim will be under the guidance a Unit Leader. This group will have special programming including leadership-building activities and field trips. They will receive a stipend of \$5/day for working at camp and will be paid each Friday for the current week.

THEATRE CAMP - WEEKS 2-6 (JUNE 12 - JULY 14) GRADES 2-7

Has your child ever dreamed of performing on stage? This is their chance to shine! Theatre campers will perform the musical, Willy Wonka Jr. This five-week experience will take them from auditions to performances while exposing your young actor to a variety of acting skills and exercises. They will be trained in the basics of theatre, performance, character development, and ensemble building. They will learn the music, choreography, and blocking for Willy Wonka Jr. They will also help create the set and make props. The campers will perform their show for an audience of family and friends the evening of July 13.

AMERICAN NINJA WARRIOR CAMP - WEEK 2 (JUNE 12-16) GRADES 1-7

Channel your inner ninja at this high-energy camp for high-energy kids! We will bring the campers to Ninjobstacles in Kettering, where campers will be coached by a competitor from the American Ninja Warriors TV show. While having fun working through the obstacles, campers will improve their balance, build upper body strength, core strength, and work on cardio and agility. Participants will also learn discipline, respect, confidence and self-worth.

DIY MINI HOUSE CAMP - WEEK 3 (JUNE 19-23) GRADES 1-5

Hannah Levinson, leads campers in designing and creating their very own mini house. Campers will make blueprints, mix their own wall paint colors, use printmaking techniques to create wallpaper, and take advantage of loose parts to create everything from furniture to people to miniature art to hang on the walls! TENNIS CAMP - WEEK 3 (JUNE 19-23) GRADES 2-7

Your future tennis ace will learn from the kid-friendly pros at Kettering Tennis Center/Quail Run Tennis Club. Campers will learn the basic tennis shots including forehand, backhand, volley, overhead, and serve. The campers will also play plenty of fun games to develop their tennis skills and footwork. LEGO CAMP BY BRIXILATED- WEEK 4 (JUNE 26-30) GRADES 1-3

Calling all creative campers! Stretch your imagination to the limit with Legos! This camp is for kids who can't get enough building and rebuilding. Campers will build custom kits and complete Lego challenges, all while learning Lego terminology and build techniques, critical thinking skills, storytelling, and foundational STEM skills. GOLF CAMP - WEEK 4 (JUNE 26-30) GRADES 2-7

Jim Rue, PGA professional, will teach this introductory golf camp at Pipestone Golf Club. Jim has played on the PGA tour for 20 years and has taught all levels of golf for 40 years. Campers will learn the fundamentals of golf including the correct grip, posture, ball position, and aim. These skills will set the stage for enjoying the game of golf for a lifetime! BABYSITTING CAMP - WEEK 5 (JULY 3-7; CLOSED ON JULY 4) GRADES 5-7

The camp will cover topics such as supervising children, caring for infants, performing basic childcare tasks, handling bedtime and challenging behavior, and finding and interviewing for babysitting jobs. MAGIC CAMP - WEEK 6 (JULY 10-14) GRADES 2-7
