At Camp Shalom, our goal is to inspire confidence in our campers. We provide a framework for lasting memories and friendships. We offer quality programs with low camper-to-staff ratios that are age appropriate, challenging and fun. We believe that children from all backgrounds can thrive immersed in the cultural treasures that Judaism offers. Camp Shalom focuses on the Jewish values of kindness, persistence, community, creativity, friendship, and courage.

CHALUTZIM (COUNSELORS IN TRAINING; ENTERING GRADES 8-9)

Chalutzim are typically experienced campers who are ready to take on some leadership. They assist counselors in engaging campers and preparing for activities. *Chalutzim* are a great opportunity for young people who are interested in becoming a camp counselor someday and would like an insider experience before taking on the full responsibility. *Chalutzim* will always be under the supervision of Camp Shalom staff. They will receive a stipend of \$5/day for working at camp and will be paid each Friday for the current week.

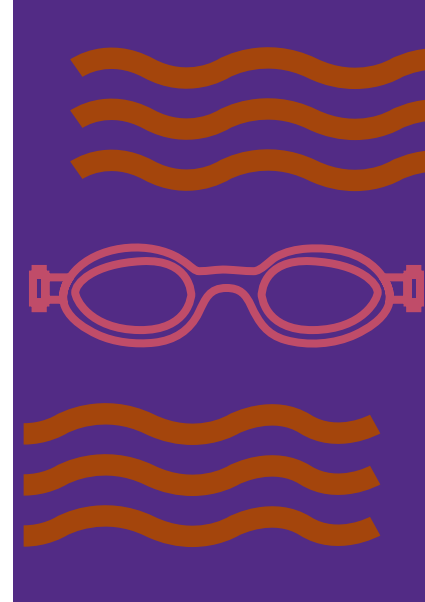
STAFF

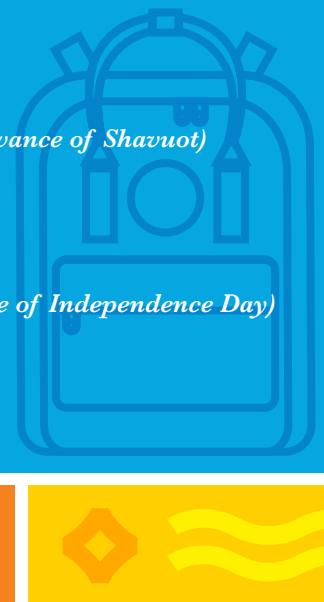

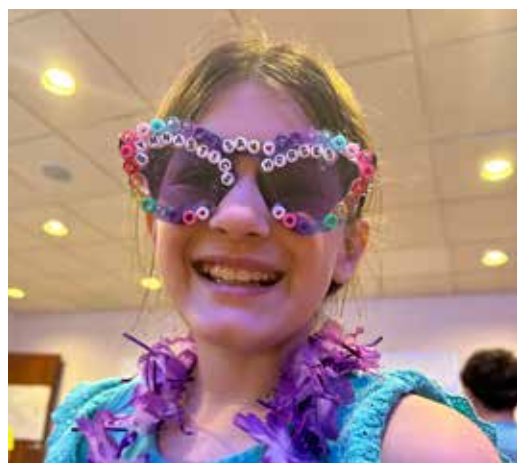


AGE GROUPS
